HELPFUL NOMINATING TIPS:

- Select a nominee who has provided volunteer services for several community organizations rather than only one organization or religious group.
- Select a volunteer who has not been honored previously by Goodwill. Honorees are listed in this pamphlet.
- Select a nominee who performed their volunteer service without pay.
- Describe the impact or difference the nominee's volunteer service has made for the organization or community.
- Provide additional information if needed. A maximum of one letter size sheet of information may be attached to the nominating form.
- The Youth Award is given to an individual who is currently a high school junior, class of 2020.
- You may nominate more than one person. This form may be duplicated.
- Nominations are reviewed and winners chosen by a panel of involved citizens and community leaders. An average of eight adult and two youth honorees will be selected. Nominators will be notified of award winners.
